This pathbreaking volume will be of interest to social security system policy makers, scholars, and students in the health and social sciences.

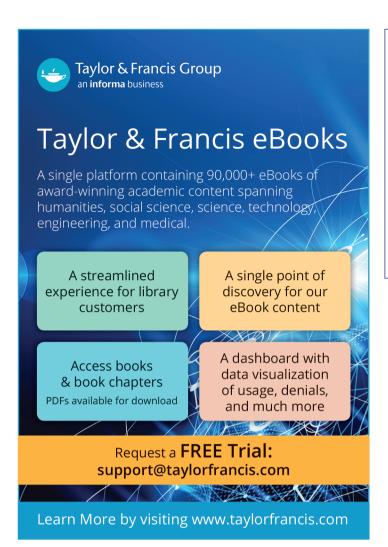
