Post-Conference Report



The Disability and Work in Canada 2020 (DWC 2020) Conference was held virtually this year over four days in late November and early December (November 25 & 26 and December 1 & 2). The theme for this year's conference was the "Strategy in Action—Pathways and Impacts".



419 Participants were registered for the event, representing 10 provinces, 1 territory and 2 countries.





On average, 75% of participants found the sessions "very good" or "excellent".

Aside from the excellent content, you are leaders in the field of virtual conferencing. The 2020 conference was substantially better run and more extensive in scope and variety than any other virtual experience this year.
