Research Analyst - PhD Student 1 year - part-time position at 10 hours per week

CORE FUNCTIONS:

The successful candidate will be enrolled in a PhD Program in health policy or public health and have an interest in applied research in work disability policy and management. The successful candidate will work closely with several researchers whose work is focused on work disability policy and management. The key research project is a mixed methods study that includes a literature synthesis and quantitative and qualitative analyses.

PRINCIPLE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- provide support for a study involving a scoping review, analysis of administrative data, and qualitative field data collection
- participate in all phases of a scoping review, which may include title abstract review, data extraction and synthesis;
- support data management for the quantitative component of the study, including extracting data from administrative data bases, developing quantitative measures to be used for analysis, and preparing written data documentation specifications
- design and create tables, charts, and graphs for research reports and presentation materials
- assist with preparation of a research report, with particular responsibility for documenting research methodology

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

The candidate must be a PhD student and have strong evidence synthesis, analytic and interpretation skills. Experience with other statistical software packages and programming languages, demonstrated involvement with previous research publications, and an interest in team work are definite assets. Please note that some travel within the GTA will be required.

SALARY

The position is funded through Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council Partnership Grant and other funding sources. The hourly rate will depend on experience and is in the range of \$25 to \$30.
